

TELL SOMEBODY  
Romans 10:14-17

- I. THERE IS AN AIM IN EVANGELISM (v. 14a-b)
  - A. To Invite a Call of Faith—*How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed?*
  - B. The Provide the Content of Faith—*And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard?*
- II. THERE ARE ACTIONS IN EVANGELISM (vv. 14c-15)
  - A. Speaking by the Christian—*And how are they to hear without someone preaching?*
  - B. Sending by the Church—*And how are they to preach unless they are sent?*
- III. THERE IS ANGUISH IN EVANGELISM (v. 16)
  - A. Rejection of the Gospel is Typical—*But they have not all obeyed the gospel.*
  - B. Rejection of the Gospel is Historical—*For Isaiah says, “Lord, who has believed what he has heard from us?”*
- IV. THERE IS ASSURANCE IN EVANGELISM (v. 17)
  - A. The Method is Sinners Hearing—*So faith comes from hearing...*
  - B. The Means is the Savior’s Message—*and hearing through the word of Christ.*
